**Casablanca, Morocco** is located **33.59 latitude** and -7.61 longitude and it is situated at **elevation 27 meters** above sea level.

**Casablanca** is a **1942 American romantic drama** film directed by [Michael Curtiz](#) based on [Murray Burnett](#) and [Joan Alison](#)'s unproduced stage play [Everybody Comes to Rick's](#). The film stars [Humphrey Bogart](#), [Ingrid Bergman](#), and [Paul Henreid](#); it also features [Claude Rains](#), [Conrad Veidt](#), [Sydney Greenstreet](#), [Peter Lorre](#), and [Dooley Wilson](#). Set during contemporary [World War II](#), it focuses on an American expatriate who must choose between his love for a woman and helping her and her husband, a [Czech Resistance](#) leader, escape from the [Vichy](#)-controlled city of [Casablanca](#) to continue his fight against the [Nazis](#). **Released on November 26, 1942.**

[Operation Torch](#) (initially called [Operation Gymnast](#)) was the British-American invasion of [French North Africa](#) during the North African campaign of [World War II](#), which started on **November 8, 1942.**

The [Americans](#) attacked at three different locations in French North Africa, one of the three being the [landings at Casablanca](#) because of its important port and the major administrative centers.<sup>[19]</sup>

Casablanca was an important strategic port during World War II and hosted the [Casablanca Conference](#) in 1943, in which [Churchill](#) and [Roosevelt](#) discussed the progress of the war. Casablanca was the site of a large American air base, which was the staging area for all American aircraft for the [European Theater of Operations](#) during World War II.
